Dear Friends,

Sometimes a film makes a big impact on us, and I have just watched such a film. It's called 'A Man Called Otto', starring Tom Hanks. Otto is extremely grumpily grieving the recent loss of his wife, and he is feeling that all he wants to do is be with her. He devises ways for that to happen, but each time is saved by someone needing his help – and he can't help but to respond their need. I'm not going to say more and risk a bigger spoiler – except to say I experienced laughter and joy along with the tears.

This has had me thinking about knowing ourselves and knowing other people. For us, as human beings, maybe there are those times when we mask who we really are, trying to protect ourselves from perceived threats – like being out of our depth doing something new, or fearing we could be 'put upon' if we offer help, or we might feel vulnerable if we take on a new responsibility. If we live a masked life, will we ever truly be able to know ourselves?

Then, knowing other people takes a lifetime and more, doesn't it? When I meet older folk in residential homes, I realise how little of their lives I can hope to know – and it's a joy if I can see a photo of their youthful days filled with their energy and passion; showing their parenting and working skills.

There is, of course, One who knows every one of us inside out (Psalm 139); who knows the gifts and potential he has blessed us with. He is the One we can be truly, safely open with because he made every bit of us and knows us – even when try to hide from him.

We have enough trouble walking in our own shoes, let alone trying to walk in anyone else's. But there are footsteps we can walk in every day; showing us the way, our Lord, Jesus Christ said: `I am the way, the truth and the life' (John 14.6)
