Dear Friends,

We only just seem to have packed away all the Christmas cards, decorations and paraphernalia and now the shops are full of red love hearts of all shapes and sizes.

This week we shall be celebrating St Valentine's Day and many people will be sending hearts and cards etc. to their loved ones. I wondered how all this began and discovered that St Valentine (Valentinus) lived in the third century and was born in Terri in Italy. His life is commemorated in Western Christianity on February 14th but in Eastern Orthodoxy, not until July 6th.

Valentine was a doctor who became a priest and he was sent to jail for performing weddings for couples during a time when new marriages were outlawed in ancient Rome. Judge Arterius was his jailer and he became involved with him in discussing Christian faith and the validity of Jesus. The judge decided to put Valentine to the test and made a bargain with him that he would do anything Valentine said if Valentine could restore the sight of his blind adopted daughter. As you can imagine, Valentine prayed to God and he laid his hands on Julia's eyes and her sight was restored. Judge Arterius kept his side of the bargain and broke all the idols around his house, fasted for three days and was baptised, then freed all Christian inmates under his authority. However, Valentine was killed for refusing to renounce his faith. But the important thing to remember is that he sent a loving note to Julia, the jailer's daughter, whose sight he had restored as well as being a teacher to her, and this eventually led to the traditional sending of Valentine's cards. So Valentine became the patron saint of love, marriages, engagements, young people, greetings, travellers, beekeepers, people with epilepsy and numerous churches.

When Valentine's day comes round this year perhaps we will be reminded of St Valentine and the greatest commandment that Jesus gave us in St Matthew's gospel. The Sadducees and Pharisees were expecting to catch Jesus out by questioning which was the greatest commandment in the law. Jesus' reply was....Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. The second is like it: love your neighbour as yourself.

So let us be obedient to our Lord this Valentine's day and strive to follow his commandment of love.
