Dear All,

Two lads were looking forward to their day out together. They'd set off early and arrived at Waterloo Station in good time to catch the train to Alton. The journey took just under 1½ hours and, on disembarking, they were excited to get as quickly as possible to their destination. It was in the early 1990s, before the days of mobile phones and GPS navigation. They assumed it would be obvious how to get there from the station - it was after all the largest theme park in the UK. After wandering around for quite a while and eventually asking for help they came to the shocking realisation of the predicament they were in. I wonder if you can guess? They were totally in the wrong place. Alton Towers is in Staffordshire and they were in Alton, Hampshire! A real 'schoolboy error'!

I first heard about this escapade on my son's wedding day when his Best Man retold the tale in his speech of how he and Simon, on a trip out during their school Half Term, had ended up 200 miles away from where they expected to be!

Not long after we moved to Devon, for one of our days out exploring the local area we planned to go to Bampton. I looked online at the 'Visit Bampton' site for information. It explained Bampton had been a wealthy wool town, gave details of an interesting town trail and also recommended a riverside walk. It mentioned that part of the walking route would be along Thames Path. Really? We used to live close to the River Thames in Hampton, but that's 190 miles away. Something was clearly not quite right.

Slowly it dawned on me that there is another Bampton. It's a Cotswold town in Oxfordshire, where Downton Abbey was filmed. Confusion had arisen because of the similarities in that both 'Bamptons' had become wealthy as a result of the wool trade and both also had river tributaries flowing through the town. In Bampton, Devon, however, it flows to the River Exe (not the Thames!)

These examples of being in the wrong place have resonance with the parables of the lost coin and the lost sheep. What happened wasn't deliberate. The coin perhaps just got dropped and rolled away, the sheep simply wandered off and ended up not being in the right place. Like the woman who searched for the missing coin and the shepherd who left everything to look for his sheep, God shows His unconditional love and grace in that, when have gone astray or are lost, inadvertently or in whatever way, He will search and find us. 'Amazing grace' indeed, so that we can say "I once was lost but now am found". Hilary
