We celebrate that Resurrection every Sunday, it is the Rock on which we build our lives and undergirds the way we live. It is our Easter gift, our belief that good will triumph over evil, that death and darkness does not have the last word.

Let us celebrate new life and new beginnings. It is Easter and Springtime and our Lord has Risen, He is Risen Indeed.
