Hello Friends!

On 21st April, Easter Monday, we heard the sad news of the death of Pope Francis. Within the eulogy delivered at the funeral in the majestic St. Peter's Square, Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re said, "We are gathered with sad hearts in prayer around his mortal remains. Yet, we are sustained by the certainty of faith, which assures us that human existence does not end in the tomb, but in the Father's house, in a life of happiness that will know no end."

It seems very poignant that Pope Francis died right after Easter Day, his earthly life's work in faithfully following the Lord, sharing the gospel, speaking truth to power, and serving others with a true servant heart, done. Jorge Mario Bergoglio (his name before he became the 266th Pope) was, for sure, a man of deep faith for whom the resurrection is the breaking of a new dawn.

The Catholic cardinals are now gathered, under great secrecy in the Vatican to elect a successor. The breaking news is that black smoke was seen coming from the stovepipe chimney above the Sistine Chapel this afternoon (Wednesday), indicating the latest ballot to be inconclusive.

Robert Harris wrote a thriller in 2016 called 'Conclave', a fictional story woven around the election of a new Pope, and according to the reviews full of skull-duggery and intrigue. I can't vouch for the storyline (I haven't read the book), and I suspect that being a work of fiction it won't tell us much about the real thing. However, it does contain an extremely interesting quote: "*Our faith is a living thing precisely, because it walks hand in hand with doubt. If there was only certainty and if there was no doubt, there would be no mystery and therefore no need for faith.*" This is a tension that we do indeed live with isn't it? But there is a lovely modern hymn, 'See what a morning, gloriously bright' and the last verse says this: 'One with the Father, Ancient of days, through the spirit, who clothes faith with certainty . . . Honour and blessing, glory and praise to the King crowned with power and authority! And we are raised with Him, death is dead, love has won, Christ has conquered; and we shall reign with Him, for He lives: Christ is risen from the dead! Hallelujah! Who knows, by the time you are reading this, the white smoke might have gone up the chimney and the 267th Pope (or 'Papa') will have been revealed. Let's pray that he, like his predecessor, will be a servant-hearted man of deep faith who faithfully follows the Lord and, guided by the Spirit, leads well. Every blessing *Cathy*
