Dear Friends,

It's strange how, within families, we often have several important occasions occurring within a short space of time. We are about to embark on one of these series starting with the birth of a new grandchild and ending with a very important birthday.

In between we have another important birthday, a graduation and a golden wedding. The well-known saying of waiting a long time for a bus and then 3 come along together, comes to mind. During the next few weeks we are going to feel very much like that and to be able to join with loved ones and celebrate something really significant is such a lovely thing to do.

We, as Christians, are still in the time of Easter. Do we feel the great need to celebrate at this time? We have had Easter Day and the great jubilation of the empty tomb, followed by several appearances of the risen Christ. We have the Ascension of Jesus witnessed by his disciples and we await the time when God would send the Holy Spirit to empower his followers at Pentecost. Can we imagine the powerful wind which seemed to fill the house they sat in and the fire which separated into tongues of flame resting on each one of them as they began speaking in different languages? This was an amazing spectacle for the large crowds in Jerusalem to take in. What a celebration this must have been for them all, and as the church was born at this time it is something we should celebrate too. For us, this is the centre of our faith, knowing the great promises that Jesus made to his disciples, and hearing about them from his witnesses.

This Sunday is Aldersgate Sunday, the day when we celebrate the foundation of the Methodist Church. It was on this day, 24th May in 1738, that John Wesley had such a profound heart-warming experience that changed his life for ever. He was at a religious meeting on Aldersgate Street, London, when he felt his heart strangely warmed; there-after travelling numerous miles on horseback across our land, to preach the Gospel and build a body of believers. Subsequently, he wrote the hymn which has been called his Conversion hymn, 454 in Singing the Faith. Where shall my wondering soul begin?

How shall I all to Heaven aspire?
A slave redeemed from death and sin, a brand plucked from eternal fire, how shall I equal triumphs raise, or sing my great deliverer's praise?

So let us 'raise the roof' as we sing our praises to God this Aldersgate Sunday.
