Dear Friends,

'For the love of baking since 1919', so says the strapline of an excellent firm of bakers in Fife that we came across recently. Their baking is truly amazing, especially their range of pies. Scotch pies, macaroni pies, steak pies, baked bean pies (yes, really!) . . . and more besides. We know they are very good because we felt it our duty to



sample many of them, for the purposes of research of course.

According to recent statistical evidence, 75% of the British population eat a pie at least once a month, and the pie industry as a whole is worth around £1.2 billion annually. It is thought that the ancient Egyptians were the original inventors of the pie, a masterful piece of gastronomical engineering. It is food with a lid you can eat, and edible sides and bottom too.

Pies are clearly thought of as very important by our government for there is even a Minister responsible for pies. That is, the Pie Minister.

When offered a pie one day, a man replied "Cut my pie into four pieces, I don't think I could eat eight". You'll get everything you have coming to you, a personal gift. This isn't pie in the sky by and by.'

Yes, we have a wonderful future to look forward to. Jesus is coming back for us one day and we may live for ever in His presence, when our lives here are complete. This is His wonderful gift.
