I recently visited the charity 'Christian Response to Eastern Europe' based in Exmouth and we talked about Shoe Box gifts going to Moldova and Ukraine for this Christmas. CR2EE are already despatching some, and they need to have our boxes by the end of October to be able to check contents and top up boxes with a bit of space in them. So we're moving our Shoe Box service forward this year to help them.

CR2EE have asked us to make it clear for which age range the box is intended, and whether girl or boy, man or woman. And to put in age-appropriate items - they aren't suggesting that this was from us, but they once came across a box for a nine-year-old boy with a razor in it!

The lids of the boxes must be liftable to allow customs checks, but can be tied with string or ribbon to keep the lid on.

We will be providing more information about things you can include. You can share making up a box with a friend or friends. If you don't have a shoe box, you can let me or Marjorie know.
