Hello Friends,

The gracious and kindly young man who served at the counter was wearing a T-shirt printed with the periodic table.

Thinking about the periodic table reminded me of a cautionary rhyme from a chemistry



lesson of long ago; "Johnny was a chemist's son, but Johnny is no more, For what he thought was H_2O was H_2SO_4 ." H_2O is, of course, water (not a volume of Encyclopaedia Britannica), and it seems fitting to tell you a very topical water story. In our garden, despite the lack of rain, we've noticed a soggy swamp that's slowly spreading. The grass around it is lush and green, while the rest of the lawn is dry and parched. A recent water bill confirmed our suspicion: we've sprung a leak in the main water supply pipe. Last week, a specialist came to investigate. He poked around in the mud with a long, rather unsophisticated spike and listened at the other end. After about twenty minutes, he declared, "I don't know exactly where the leak is and I don't like to dig large holes," adding, "after all, the more ground I dig out, the more I've got to put back." And with that, he left. We await further developments.

Water is a remarkable substance, isn't it? It quenches our thirst, hydrates us, cleanses us, and forms the foundation of countless useful chemicals. It keeps everything flowing. How blessed we are to be able to turn on a tap and draw clean, fresh water at will (even if, from time to time, it decides to escape and start its own unofficial irrigation scheme). Water is a basic necessity of life – it is live giving. The Bible has many references to 'Living Water'.

The gospel writer John recorded an occasion when Jesus was at a feast: 'On the last day, the climax of the festival, Jesus stood and shouted to the crowds, "Anyone who is thirsty may come to me! Anyone who believes in me may come and drink! For the Scriptures declare, 'Rivers of living water will flow from his heart.'" (When he said 'living water', he was speaking of the Spirit, who would be given to everyone believing in him). John 7:37–38, NLT)

Water finds a way. It seeps through cracks, saturates soil, and brings life where all was barren. Likewise, God's Spirit moves gently but powerfully, reaching into the hidden places of our hearts, healing what's broken, and refreshing what's dry. So may we keep on returning to the fountain of life. May we drink deeply of His grace, and let His Living Water flow freely through us—bringing hope, healing, and renewal.
