Dear Friends,

Despite the long and hot summer days, I am amazed how the fruit trees and bushes have kept producing. The damsons, plums and apples, particularly, have kept going, providing me with lots of tasks to do. Irrespective of the condition of the fruit, I have managed to put most of it to good use by stewing, freezing or juicing. The sun we have been experiencing has, of course, been very good for ensuring that I have a sweet fruit crop this year.

As I have been dealing with the fruit, discarding the parts either bruised, going rotten or being enjoyed by creepy-crawlies, it has made me think of human beings. I wonder how many of us think we are perfect?

However hard we attempt to do or say our best, there are times when we know we fail; and worse still, other people see that we fail too! Our Father God sees us just as we are, however full of imperfections, and is able to mould us for His good. He is a forgiving Father and His love extends to each one of us, whatever. How wonderful! The little word 'sorry' is often so difficult to articulate but it makes such a difference to us when we say it to those we have hurt or to our Father God, and it makes a difference to both them and us.

Just as I have been able to use the fruit by dealing with its bad bits, so God sees our bad bits and is able to mould us as He sees fit. The words of StF395 come to my mind. 'Spirit of the living God – fall afresh on me. Break me, mould me, fill me – Spirit of the living God – fall afresh on me.'

May we make this our prayer knowing that however we are or whatever we do, God can make us into His fruit and make good use of us.
