Dear Friends,

May I, in anticipation, be the first to wish you a Happy New Year! I mean, of course, the new 2025/26 Church year which will start next Sunday, 30th November with Advent Sunday.

So today, 23rd November is the last Sunday of the current Church year and on which the Church celebrates 'Christ the King'.

I was interested to read that this is – in Church terms - a fairly new addition to the Church calendar.

The early years of 20 th century had been fraught with upheaval as the First World War had been waged and some of the main **Europ**ean monarchies had been overthrown, with new earthly regimes replacing them. So it was only in1925 that Pope Pius XI had, in response, instituted the Feast of Christ the King to remind Christians that their true loyalty was to their spiritual ruler in heaven as opposed to any earthly sovereignty. Since then, this feast has been embraced by most Christian denominations. Jesus "kingship", unlike so many earthy dominions, is wrapped up in his radical, all-powerful compassion and love.

As we move into the season of Advent, waiting once again for the arrival of the Christ child, we can focus on the person of Jesus – the incarnate Christ - the baby who was brought out of the obscurity of a lowly birth in a stable to be our one, true King to love, and to seek justice for all people.
